-  See, touch, and smell a real-live beehive and learn how bees are important to our environment
-  Reflect and record in journals thoughts about their responsibility to protect the planet
-  Learn about sustainable eating practices by making their own snack drink
-  Explore bicycling as an impact-free transportation option and learn bicycle safety skills
-  Learn about how energy is produced and used in our daily lives
-  Race solar powered cars and learn how we can use the sun to create energy
-  Explore animal signs, animal habitats, and animal conservation
-  See native rehabbed wildlife and learn what to do to protect native species
-  Discover gardening by making seed tape
-  Learn how kids are taking action around the world to be more planet friendly

At each exhibit, kids will earn tokens so that they may later vote for their favorite earth-friendly organizations.
